This VIP program is a non-confrontational neighborhood patrol program designed to reduce crime through increased cooperation between citizens and police. Volunteers donate time to patrol their neighborhood by driving their own vehicles or vehicles provided by their community organization. They are trained by the Dallas Police Department to observe, recognize and report suspicious and criminal activity in their neighborhood. The VIP programs allow citizens to take an active role in crime prevention by acting as the eyes and ears of the police department. It builds camaraderie between the residents of the neighborhood by creating a safer environment and better quality of life. It also sends a message that the neighborhood is aware, alert and will not tolerate criminal activity.
